TWO CC GRADS WIN 2019 SCHOLARSHIPS

The Alpha Association of Colorado is pleased to announce the 2019 winners of our two scholarships for graduate studies. Emma Whitehead, a 2016 graduate of Colorado College, was awarded the \$3,500 scholarship, and Jedediah Doane, a 2014 graduate of Colorado College, the \$1,500 scholarship. This year seven PBK initiates applied for the scholarships; all

were well-qualified and had excellent credentials.

The requirements to apply for the scholarships were changed this year. Instead of answering four questions and submitting a writing sample completed for their undergraduate work, we asked applicants to send us a personal essay describing how their undergraduate education and experiences “challenged

them, changed them, added value to their lives, shaped their goals and passions, and provided them with tools for their future success.” The committee felt this new application improved both the submission and evaluation processes.

We are grateful to all Alpha Association members who have made donations to our Scholarship Fund this past year, making these awards possible. We also thank the Scholarship Committee members for their dedicated work in reviewing the applications. The committee consisted of Barbara Berryman (Chair); Tom Hall; Rob Wellington; Jim Elkins, Ph.D.; Amy Rell, Ph.D.; and Julie DeWoody. The PBK Alpha Association board approved the committee’s recommendations.

Since 1994 the Alpha Association has awarded \$78,500 in scholarships.

Annual Meeting — Saturday, October 5, 2019

Jeff Shoemaker: “No Water, No Colorado: The Environmental and Economic Benefits of Engaging in Urban Waterways”



Since 1982, Jeff Shoemaker has been the Executive Director of The Greenway Foundation, which under his leadership has partnered with countless public and private organizations to collectively create over \$750 million of environmental, recreational, water quality, and flood control improvements along the South Platte River and its numerous tributaries throughout Metro Denver and beyond. Area waterways are now home to over 100 miles of multi-use recreational trails and over 100 acres of parks and natural areas. Also, over 100,000 acre-feet of water quality and quantity enhancements have been made to these rivers and creeks.

In addition, The Greenway Foundation has created and oversees the most recognized award-winning environmental education program in Colorado — SPREE (South Platte River Environmental Education). In addition, the foundation engages in numerous cultural and community events, along with a variety of youth employment opportunities, all focused on engaging the Metro Denver community (and beyond) with their greatest natural resources — our urban and regional waterways.

In November 2018 Jeff served on the Executive Committee of Denver’s successful Ballot Measure 2A, which secured over \$35 million per year for Denver’s parks and waterways. He also served as the chair of Metro Denver’s successful Ballot Measure 7G, which secured over \$20 million per year for the Urban Drainage and Flood Control District.

Jeff is a proud graduate of Denver Public Schools and the University of Colorado. He was a public school teacher from 1978 to 1982, served as a Republican member of the Colorado Legislature from 1987 to 1992, and was appointed to two terms on the CSU Board of Trustees from 1999 to 2008. Jeff was appointed to the MSU Denver Board of Trustees in 2016. He also serves as the president of a local non-profit organization, Up Close and Musical, which provides professional performances of classical music to elementary schools by Colorado Symphony Orchestra musicians.

Emma Whitehead



Born in Denver, Emma Whitehead graduated *cum laude* from Colorado College with a degree in Political Science.

During her undergraduate studies, Emma was twice awarded grants to conduct original research on identity and governance in Spain, Belgium, Switzerland, and Eastern Europe. She was involved in outdoor recreation and the arts, as well as holding positions in the Admissions and Financial Aid Offices.

For the past three years, Emma has worked to blend psychology, politics, and leadership development in her work and volunteer activities. After working with the Center for Creative Leadership, she went on to provide *pro bono* legal interpretation and mentorship to new Americans navigating the college application process. Emma is also a graduate of Emerge Colorado, which trains women to run for public office. She is currently part of a documentary film team that leverages the power of storytelling to educate and inspire action on topics including wilderness conservation, mass incarceration, and the global refugee crisis. In her spare time, she enjoys rock climbing, cooking, and salsa dancing.

Emma will attend the London School of Economics, pursuing an MSc in Organizational and Social Psychology.

Jedediah Doane



Jed Doane grew up in Salt Lake City and graduated from Colorado College with distinction in Biology: Organisms, Ecology, and Evolution, *magna cum laude*. A finalist for the Thomas J. Watson Fellowship, his interests at CC ranged from fire ecology to biochemistry to jazz. He led backcountry orientation trips in the Front Range and served on the college's Sustainability Action Committee. He is currently a fourth-year medical student at the University of Utah's School of Medicine, where he remains active in research and the exploration of wild places. His research interests include the integration of technology in low-resource healthcare data collection. He is pursuing a career in internal medicine.

In his personal essay Jed wrote, "An education with ample exposure to the liberal arts and sciences has made me a better future physician, student, and citizen of the world."

PBK MENTORSHIP PROGRAM

For the past few months we have been working on setting up a PBK Colorado mentorship program. We are building on work done by the DC Association, and the goal is to connect members one-on-one to not only share professional advice, but to foster the intellectual curiosity that brings the Phi Beta Kappa community together at its core.

Mentoring is a powerful personal and career development tool that can enable the mentee to achieve or exceed his or her life goals and aspirations. As explained on the

Our hope is to launch the program this fall. Diane Palese, Kristin Adcock, Sue Kiernan, Ian Alexander, and Greg Sorensen are developing our mentorship program. PHI BETA KAPPA IN COLORADO

After last year's Triennial, the Alpha Association has been meeting with representatives of the Alpha Chapter at CU Boulder, the Gamma Chapter at DU, and the Delta Chapter at CSU to find ways to work more closely together and to support each other. (We are hoping that the Beta Chapter at CC will join our efforts.)

One of the initiatives we are working on is a Colorado Scholars Program to enhance the image and visibility of Phi Beta Kappa within Colorado; to foster cooperation among the four chapters and the Alpha Association; and to provide opportunities for PBK scholars at Colorado chapters to contribute to intellectual life on other Colorado campuses.

A scholar from any Colorado PBK chapter would be selected to go to other campuses to

- give a public talk at a convenient time and place
- make classroom visits
- conduct discussions with students

The program would be similar to the national PBK Visiting Scholars program, but focusing on scholars within Colorado. This program could also be expanded for scholars to visit a wider range of educational institutions within Colorado, such as community colleges or colleges without PBK chapters.

Each chapter and the association would provide an initial \$500 for program expenses, including a \$100 honorarium to each speaker. The goal is to launch the speaker's program this fall or in 2020.

IN MEMORIAM

Anne B. Cvaniga, was born in 1910 near Trinidad, Colorado, and died at the age of 108 in Denver in March. A co-owner of a small manufacturing company that made military parts during World War II, she patented several of her designs for specific product parts. After selling her part of the company, she returned to Colorado and attended the University of Colorado, where she was elected to Phi Beta Kappa in 1957.

St. Clair Hultsman died this past spring in New Orleans. He was elected to Phi Beta Kappa in 1955 at Tulane University and majored in physics.

Anne Tauriello, a long-time Alpha Association member and former Vice President for Programs, passed away on December 18, 2018. As an art major, she particularly enjoyed art history programs and tours at the Denver Art Museum.

The board of directors has made a \$25 memorial donation to the Members' Endowment in honor of each of these former members.
